The Development of a Missionary Heart Pt 2

A Missionary is simple "A person sent on a mission!" Jesus was the ultimate "Missionary".

"As my Father hath sent me, even so send I you." Jn 20:21 Barnabas was one of the first N.T.

"Missionaries". He was "sent" to Antioch; (Acts 11:19-25) Asia minor; (Acts 13) and Cyprus. Acts 15:39 Ultimately He was "Sent" to "Represent" God's heart! 2 Cor. 5:20 "we are ambassadors for Christ"

Missionaries are not "Super Saints"! They're "ordinary" Christians who have recognized God's "extraordinary" heart and partnered with Him to reach others. By examining Barnabas' journey, we can better understand God's process for developing His heart in each of us.

Barnabas was willing to:

1. Become An Encouragement to those around him Acts 4:32-36; Gal. 6:10

"Joses, who by the apostles was surnamed Barnabas, (which is, being interpreted, The son of consolation,) a Levite, and of the country of Cyprus," (Acts 4:36) Parak'lēsis: comfort/encouragement (Jn 14:16)

- **A. Barnabas Was A Builder!** (Acts 11:24) He Encouraged his church in Jerusalem (Acts 4:36); Saul when others rejected him (Acts 9:27); Encouraged the Church in Antioch (Acts 11:22,23); sought Saul's to help in Antioch (Acts 11:25); Chosen to plant churches with Paul (Acts 13); Encouraged John Mark after a failure. (Acts 15:37-39)
- Acts 11:24 "For he was a good man, (agathos: useful, beneficial) and full of the Holy Ghost and of faith: and much people were added unto the Lord."

Are you a "Son/daughter" of consolation?

2. Be Willing To <u>Sacrifice</u> (<u>Prioritize</u>) To Accomplish God's Will. This requires us to:

- A. Understand Priorities. Jn 21:15 "Lovest thou me more than these?"
 - Col 1:17-18 "he is before all things, and by him all things consist. he is the head of the body, ... that in all things he might have the preeminence." (See also Ex. 20:3; Deut. 6:4,5; Mt. 6:33; Mt 22:37,38)
- **B.** Understand Stewardship.
 - 1) A Steward is a *Manager*, not an owner! (Mt 25:14-30; 1 Cor 4:1,2)
 - 2) The early church understood this! Acts 4:32
 - 3) Barnabas understood this. Acts 4:37
 - 4) Someday we'll understand this! Rev. 4:11; 1 Cor. 3:9
- C) Our Resources Are A Trust And A Test! Luke 16:10-15
- 3. Believe In The Power Of God To <u>Change</u> Lives. 2 Cor. 3:18; 5:17 God is in the saving and Transformation business!
- A. Barnabas "Invested" In Others. See Heb. 11:26
 - 1) He took risks to work with Saul (Paul). Acts 9:26-28
 - 2) He gave John Mark a 2nd chance. (Acts 15:37-39)
- 4. Expose himself To What God Is Doing Outside Of his **Comfort** Zone.
 - A. Barnabas Was Willing To Go On A "Short Term" Mission Trip. (307 miles)
 - 1) Rather than criticizing, he encouraged and helped. (Acts 11:19-30)

- B. He Was Willing To "Share The Load" With Others. Vs 25,26
 - 1) He discipled Saul (Paul) who later replaced him as the leader. (Acts 13:1)
 - 2) He had John the Baptist's attitude: John 3:30 "He must increase, but I must decrease."
- B. Became instrumental in raising funds for others. Acts 11:27-30
- 5. Learn To Listen (And *Respond*) The God's Voice. ACTS 13:1-4
 - $\boldsymbol{A}. \ \ It$ was while Barnabas and Saul were ministering in Antioch that

God called them to be "Missionaries"! Acts 13:2-4 "As they ministered to the Lord, the Holy Ghost said, Separate me Barnabas and Saul for the work whereunto I have called them."

B. Their obedience resulted in the Gospel getting to Europe! (and America!)

Application: To develop into a "World Class Christian"...

- 1. Purpose to be an encouragement. Look for ways to Lift up others!
- 2. Be willing to Sacrifice the temporary for the Eternal. "Downsize" to "Do More" for God!
- 3. Believe in God's power to change lives! Invest in others!
- 4. Expose Yourself To What God Is Doing Outside Of your Comfort zone.

Missions newsletters, take missions trips, visit a Crisis Pregnancy Center, Prison, or Rescue Mission.

5. Learn to "Listen" for (and to) God's Voice. (Isaiah 6:8) "I heard the voice of the Lord ...who will go for us? Then said I, "Here I am, Send Me!"

Satan tries to convince us that we are unusable and keeps us so preoccupied with the cares of this world we fail to invest in eternity. (Mark 4:19)

Jesus still challenges us to "Lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven... For where your treasure is, there shall your heart be also." Mt. 6:20.21

Are you willing to exchange your "wood, hay, and stubble", for God's "Gold, Silver, and Precious stones"? 1 Cor. 3:12

Can you imagine the interest on the investment Barnabas has earned because of his "supporting role" in the lives of so many? (1 Cor 2:9)
